Christmas Tree Decoration Cookies

Ingredients

- 140g icing sugar
- 1tsp vanilla extract
- 1 egg yolk
- 250g butter
- 375g plain flour

Method

- 1. Mix the sugar, vanilla, egg yolk and butter together until combined. Add the flour and mix to a firm dough. Chill the dough for 20-30 mins. Preheat the oven to 190C or gas mark 5 and line two oven trays with baking paper.
- 2. Roll out the dough on a lightly floured surface, then cut out your desired shapes. Use cutters if you would like. Using the tip of a skewer, cut a small hole in the top of each cookie. Bake for 10-12 mins until lightly golden.
- 3. Put the biscuits onto the wire rack to cool. While they are cooling, mix 200g of icing sugar with a couple of drops of water. Add food colouring if you would like. Spread over the cooled biscuits, decorate with your favourite sprinkles, then thread with ribbon when dry.



Important Messages

Please ensure that your child has a change of clothes in their bag every day. This should include at least two pairs of underwear and trousers/leggings, one top, one pair of socks and a pair of shoes (if there is room in your child's bag). This does not need to be uniform. Please do this even if your child is fully toilet trained, as they could still need changing if they fall in a puddle or spill something over themselves.

We encourage children to bring a morning snack to school. Please be aware that we have a 'nut free' policy and no nuts or products containing traces of nuts should be sent into school. Grapes should be cut in half length ways.

Pre-Prep 1

Pre-Prep 1 have had a brilliant half term. We started with our topic all about Special Days, where we learnt about Bonfire Night, Diwali, Remembrance Day, Odd Sock Day and Children in Need!

We then moved onto the topic of Dinosaurs. The children loved pretending to be palaeontologists in the role play area and digging for dinosaur bones. They also enjoyed playing in the dinoswamp water tray!



In Phonics this half term, we have continued to learn the Phase 2 sounds and tricky words, and working on our segmenting and blending skills.

In Maths, we have been learning how to subitise up to three and five, linking numerals to quantity up to 10 and comparing groups, using vocabulary such as 'more than' and 'fewer than'.

Pre-Prep 2

Pre-Prep 2 have been working very hard these past few weeks and we have seen their development come on so much. In this half-term we began by learning about 'Celebrations and Events' that were happening, such as Diwali, Remembrance Day and Children in Need.

We have been continuing to develop our knowledge of Level 2 Phonics by practising sounds such as 'm', 'd', 'g', and 'o' through the Twinkl scheme. The children are also showing some promising improvement when writing letters and even their own names with guidance when necessary.

All the children enjoyed our Transport topic and learning how transport has changed over time. We also were so pleased with how many families engaged with our junk-modelling task to make a robot out of recyclable materials. Throughout the last two weeks, we have been learning about our new topic 'Christmas'. We have been practising Christmas songs, making decorations, cards and even had a Winter Performance for our families. The children did so well and made us all very proud.

In Mathematics we have been using some initial problem-solving skills in practical playbased situations and comparing groups by using the language of more and fewer. In Expressive Arts and Design, we have been putting our arts and crafts skills to the test by using different materials and techniques to join pieces together. Finally, our PE lessons have given us great opportunities to have hopping and skipping races, as well as build up our gross motor muscles.


Pre-Prep 3

In our maths topic we have been looking at many different objectives including 2D and 3D shapes. The children were given a project to create 3D shape junk models which they presented to the class. We have also focused on our counting skills identifying one more and one less of numbers.

We put on a fantastic Winter Performance and filled our teachers and parents/carers with so much joy!
