We also enjoyed a trip to the Museum of Liverpool as part of our topic and were delighted when the staff at the museum commented on how well our pupils behaved, which was lovely to hear.

We were so proud of how well the children performed the winter production this year; they worked really hard in the run up and have had a fantastic week celebrating their achievements this week.

Next term we will be starting our 'Great Fire of London' topic and looking at place value within 20.

It has been a very busy half term for Year 2 and it has flown by!

In Maths, we began the term with word and reasoning problems before moving onto our money unit. The children have spent lots of time adding coins and working out change. We have just begun multiplication and have used festive themed questions to help us learn.

In English, the children have incorporated language features from Autumn 1 into writing postcards, job adverts and Haiku poems. We are very proud to have seen some creative adjectives, verbs and adverbs used in the children's work!

Through our termly topic 'What a Wonderful World', children have been able to name and locate Earth's continents and oceans. We also discussed the types of habitats across our planet and the different animals which live in them. This learning was brought to life with a workshop in the World Museum where we saw the animals which habituate in rockpools.

We spent lots of time rehearsing for our Winter Performance and were so proud of how well the children did! We wish all families a safe winter break and we are looking forward to hearing about the adventures the children get up to when we see them again in January!

Wow! What an amazing, busy half term we have had in Year 3.

In English, pupils studied non-fiction travel brochures about Liverpool. The pupils learnt about the language features of a brochure and used their knowledge of this to help them plan, draft, edit and perform their own brochure about Liverpool. Following this, the pupils read 'The Curse of Cogston House' and wrote their own mystery story inspired by the book with two alternative endings. The stories were full of creative language, suspense, and imagination! Towards the end of term, we focused heavily on our spelling, punctuation, and grammar and learnt how to accurately use direct speech within our work.

In Maths, pupils have been very busy working on their multiplication skills using repeated addition and subtraction, number lines, equal groups, arrays, and inverse operations to help them solve calculations. Throughout our Multiplication and Division unit, we have been primarily focusing on recapping our 2-, 5- and 10- times tables as well as learning our 3-, 4-, and 8- times tables. The pupils have loved using catchy songs to help them memorise their multiplication and division facts.

In Science, Year 3 have been learning all about light and its importance as an energy source. Pupils explored what reflection and darkness means and how mirrors reflect light to create a clear image. Following this, we discussed the properties of reflective materials and their importance in increasing visibility and safety in low light conditions. In addition, the children discovered the benefits and dangers of the sun and investigated how UV rays can damage our eyes. Year 3 also celebrated World Science Day at the beginning of November. In aid of World Science Day, pupils explored how water and bubbles can bend light rays allowing us to see the different waves of light.

This half term we enjoyed a brilliant day out at the Story Barn in Calderstones Park. The trip allowed pupils to delve deeper into our Autumn 1 topic, The Stone Age. Pupils enjoyed a guided Heritage Trail foraging walk through the park. The children learnt about how Stone Age people lived and created beautiful artwork inspired by Stone Age cave paintings.

During this half term, we have been extremely busy practicing for our Winter Performances. All the children have worked hard, and we are very proud of how well they performed.

During this half term, we spent lots of time preparing for our Winter Performance of Home Alone. The children worked extremely hard, practising every day and learning their lines. We think it's safe to say that it definitely paid off! We are so proud of how well the children performed, especially considering how many lines there were to remember! Year 4 Yellow were excellent on their recorders and their hard work paid off!

We hope that you have a lovely Christmas and we are looking forward to welcoming the children back to school in the New Year!




