



ENGLISH

MR DAVIES



Throughout the term pupils have been expanding their vocabulary and developing their spellings with weekly grammar activities, and have also enjoyed a range of topics: Year 7 have been reading the Louis Sachar novel, *There's a Boy in the Girls' Bathroom*, while developing their use of PEE chains to produce more detailed written responses. Year 8 have finished reading the Robert Swindells novel *Stone Cold* and have been exploring the theme of homelessness. They have also developed their reading of a range of war themed comprehension fiction extracts. Year 9 pupils have completed their initial reading of the GCSE text *A Christmas Carol* by Charles Dickens. They have been studying literary techniques such as imagery, symbolism and the effects of language.

Year 7

We have worked very hard this term in Y7 and this has been reflected in our end of term assessments. It has been a pleasure to listen to the pupils complete their first speaking assessments. The pupils have worked hard during their first term at Auckland College, and I am very proud of their efforts.

Year 8

This term we have focused on verbs and how to use them in the future tense. Y8 pupils have shown good knowledge and are becoming more confident when talking about their free time plans for the weekend.

Year 9

Year 9 have worked super hard this term on the first GCSE topic 'Holidays'. This topic is all about using the past tense, which can be tricky in Spanish, as there are two past tenses to choose from! This will take time to consolidate, but I'm sure Y9 will continue to work hard to accomplish this.

The GCSE class have covered several mini topics this term within our main topic, 'Customs and Traditions'. We have practised writing 90 word answers about food, special events, music festivals and our daily routines. We have dissected longer passages of written Spanish which has given us the opportunity to hone our reading skills and adapt example answers.

I have been impressed by the way Y10 have started the GCSE course, and it is refreshing to see them using their KS3 knowledge to hit the ground running!

Y11 will complete their Spanish mock exams in January and have received revision packs to help them to prepare over the winter break

Year 8 Art



Year 10 and 11

During this term, years 10 & 11 have continued to develop their ideas responding to the themes 'By the Sea' and 'Identity'. They have been experimenting with various materials and techniques such as painting, collage, printing and drawing, to create their final designs. Pupils have researched into the work of varied artists of their choice to develop a personal and meaningful response relating to their theme. Keep up the good work year 10 & 11.



HISTORY

GCSE pupils have been studying the Component 1b topic: The Normans. They have been researching life in Anglo-Saxon Britain, the succession crisis after the death of Edward the Confessor and the battles of Fulford, Stamford Bridge and Hastings. They have also explored the different stages of rebellion against William the Conqueror and how he maintained control of England.

GEOGRAPHY

Year 9 have been studying population. They have looked at how the population is distributed and youthful and ageing populations and the benefits and negatives of these. We plotted data on population pyramids, using our maths skills to help us.

Throughout this term, Students have been introduced and developing their current skills and techniques in Badminton through games and challenges.

Year 7 have been familiarising themselves with the lines of the court, ready position, handling of the racket and setting up and taking down of the badminton nets. Students have been working on their service and rallies with their partners, whilst being introduced to certain shots to outwit their opponents.

Year 8 has been further developing their previous taught skills from last year. This year having them introduced to more technical shots to play against their opponents and encourage strategic thinking, This alongside the introduction of the rules of doubles.

Year 9 has been working on their teamwork, communication and tactics in doubles, further practising all shots used in Badminton, working on positioning and tactics in doubles with being left and right or front and back formation.

GCSE has been working on Unit 1, this unit being their practical sport. Looking into their team sports and individual sports and the components. Researching into the rules, regulations and scoring systems, the main roles of officials within their two sports and creating an observation checklist to observe others and themselves to evaluate sporting performances.

During First Aid, we have covered some of the basics including the dangers of completing First Aid, the Recovery Position, CPR and bandages.




Enhanced Curriculum
