


# AUCKLAND COLLEGE SECONDARY NEWSLETTER



lives.










#### Sick To Death Museum


What a great day our GCSE



Good luck everyone and hopefully we might get to the next phase of the competition.






# ART MISS BRADSHAW

Year 8 and 9 have been developing their skills in 3Dimensional form using clay. They are all very proud and I cannot wait to share the final outcomes once they are painted.






## IT/ICT MISS HODSON










# **GEOGRAPHY**MISS WHITEHOUSE

Year 7 have been learning how to talk about their free time interests using actions to help us to consolidate the new vocabulary. This involved some games using those actions which quickly became very competitive!




Year 9 have been learning how to give opinions on their school subjects and their uniform. The stand-out moment for me was listening to their fantastic pronunciation; it really is great!




# SCIENCE KS3 MISS MCKENZIE

sound waves travel.








# **ENGLISH**MISS MAHONEY

# ENHANCED CURRICULUM ANIMATION


Pupils have been learning about 'Stop Motion Animation'.
Pupils have been creating characters and scenery to be used in the filming of their own stop-motion animations.












# ENHANCED CURRICULUM FIRST AID
